## Bringing strong returns to the local Northland economy

The kiwifruit industry is a major contributor to regional New Zealand, including Northland. In fact, the kiwifruit industry **contributed \$92 million** to the Northland economy in 2022/23 and provided **hundreds of jobs to locals.** 

The industry is booming, but growing delicious, high quality kiwifruit isn't easy – it takes skill, tenacity, passion, innovation and good orchard practices.
