The condition of State highways in the Bay of Plenty needs to be addressed. 3 of the 4 state highways leading towards the port of Tauranga are in need of heavy maintenance. Not only are there time constraints issues but there is also potential damage to produce and to vehicles.

I would ensure we are lobbying LTNZ to get improvements to our state highways.

District councils also need to focus their attention on reading as a core function.
